Show Rules and Regulations

1. Entries

Any animal identified with the Holstein Association USA Inc. that is 87% or higher Registered Holstein Ancestry and owned by a Pennsylvania Holstein Association member or Pennsylvania Holstein Association Junior member is eligible. All partnership or syndicate members must be members of the Pennsylvania Holstein Association or Pennsylvania Junior Holstein Association. Animals must be housed in Pennsylvania with verification provided by an official health certificate or official DHIA sheet. Observe the entry deadline and mail entries and fees as instructed for the show to be entered.

2. Certificates of Registry

Certificates of registration from Holstein USA Inc. must be in the exhibitor's name and available to show management when the animal is checked into the show. If the certificate of registration from the Holstein Association USA Inc. is not in the exhibitor's name at the time of the show, then the animals may be eligible to be shown if a signed transfer with payment attached and the Holstein Association USA Inc. registry certificate is turned over to the show management before the show. **ANIMALS WITHOUT REGISTRY CERTIFICATES WILL NOT BE PERMITTED TO SHOW AT THE STATE SHOWS OR REGIONAL SHOWS.**

3. Group Entries

Entries for group classes may be submitted as a late entry, or submitted when animals are checked into the show. However, entry by deadline date will ensure listing in the show catalog.

4. Dry Cow Classes

A dry cow may be shown in the wet class, but not both classes. To show in the dry cow class, an animal must have milked at least 305 days, or have a record already completed as shown on a DHI form. If it's less than 305 days, the record will be terminated on show day. If she is still milking after 305 days, her record can continue. To show as a dry cow, she must be milked out for the show.

5. Exhibitor Defined

The individual, who is housing the animals, with verification provided by an official health certificate and/or official DHI sheet, will be considered the exhibitor for tabulation of Premier Exhibitor points.

6. Breeder Defined

The individual whose prefix appears on the Registry Certificate shall be considered the breeder of the animals for tabulation of Premier Breeder points.

7. Partnership or Syndicate Ownership

Regardless of ownership, Premier Exhibitor points will be awarded to the individual who is housing the animal. Pertaining to Premier Breeder, all points will be awarded to the prefix. **THERE WILL BE NO SPLITTING OF PREMIER BREEDER AND/OR EXHIBITOR POINTS.**

**\*\*8. Junior Exhibitor Defined- New for 2008**

To be eligible for Junior Recognition, a junior owned animal must be shown by the Pennsylvania Junior Holstein member owner or another Pennsylvania Junior Holstein member. **Animals must be in the Junior members name and processed by Holstein USA by January 1 for all cows including Fall Yearlings in Milk and by June 1 for all heifers. Animals leased through the Holstein Association USA Lease Program are eligible for Youth Recognition at Pennsylvania Holstein sponsored shows. Leased animals must be shown by the lessee at all shows or the lease will be terminated!**

9. Premier Awards

Total points will be determined by the six highest point animals for both Premier Breeder and Premier Exhibitor. Points are figured on the following basis:

10. Class Descriptions

**Spring Calf** - Born March 1, 2008 - April 30, 2008

**Winter Calf** - Born December 1, 2007 - February 29, 2008

**Fall Calf** - Born September 1, 2007 - November 30, 2007

**Summer Yearling** - Born June 1, 2007- August 31, 2007

**Spring Yearling** - Born March 1, 2007- May 31, 2007

**Winter Yearling** - Born December 1, 2006 - February 28, 2007

**Fall Yearling** - Born September 1, 2006 - November 30, 2006

**Junior Best Three Females** - Three animals, Fall Yearlings not in milk and under, bred by exhibitor and carrying the same prefix and at least one to be owned entirely by exhibitor. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry.

**\*\*Dry Cow** - Born Prior to September 1, 2005

**Fall Yearling in Milk** – Born September 1, 2006 – November 30, 2006 **(Regional Shows & Fall Show)**

**Junior 2 Year Old** - Born March 1, 2006 - August 31, 2006

**Senior 2 Year Old** - Born September 1, 2005 - February 28, 2006

**Junior 3 Year Old** - Born March 1, 2005 - August 31, 2005

**Senior 3 Year Old** - Born September 1, 2004 - February 28, 2005

**Four Year Old** - Born September 1, 2003- August 31, 2004

**Five Year Old** - Born September 1, 2002 - August 31, 2003

**\*\*125,000 lb. Class** - Cows any age that have produced 125,000 lbs of milk on standard DHIA or DHIR tests. Verification of production must be available at check-in or ringside. **Note:** An animal can be exhibited in either the individual age class or the 125,000 lb. class - NOT BOTH.

**Six Years & Over** - Born prior to September 1, 2002

**Best Three Females** - Three females, any age, bred by exhibitor and carrying the same prefix and at least one to be owned entirely by exhibitor. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry.

**Produce of Dam** - Two animals, any age, any sex, and the produce of one cow. The dam must be named. Animals need not be owned by the same exhibitor.

**Dam & Daughter** - Two animals, one cow and her daughter, any age, need not be owned by one exhibitor.

**Best Animal Bred & Owned - Open Show** - The name of the breeder and owner must be identical on the Registry Certificate in order to be considered for Best Animal Bred & Owned of the Open Show, or the owner must have use of the prefix

**Best Animal Bred & Owned – Youth Show** - The name of the breeder and owner must be identical on the Registry Certificate in order to be considered for Best Animal Bred & Owned of the Youth Show.



State Show Only (Spring, Regional and Fall) -

We will select a youth Junior Champion, youth Senior Champion and a youth Grand Champion. After the placing of each class, junior owned and exhibited animals will be pulled out of line and recognized. The first two places of each class will compete for champion honors and must again be shown by a Junior member. Any Pennsylvania Holstein Junior Association member is eligible for these awards.

- There will not be a Spring Heifer Calf Class at the Spring Show.

- Unfresh Junior 2 Year Olds will receive 10 points toward Premier Breeder and Exhibitor and will show in a class for unfresh Junior 2 Year Olds.

- Milking Junior 2-Year Olds **will be** shown at the 2008 Spring Show.

- There **will be** a Winter Calf Class at 2008 Spring Show.

**-Fall Yearling in Milk will be shown at the Regional Championship Shows and the Fall Show in 2008**

11. All animals must show in their proper Age Class. No animals will be permitted to show in a class above or below her birthdate.

12. Health Requirements

- 1.) All animals must be accompanied by an official health certificate signed by an accredited veterinarian that includes a statement that the animal(s) identified have been immunized against IBR, PI3 and BVD. Animals that have never been vaccinated against BVD or have not been vaccinated against BVD during the previous 12 months, must receive one dose of modified live virus vaccine given at least 15 days and not more than 180 days before the show or two doses of killed vaccine, two to four weeks apart, with the last dose given at least 15 days and not more than 180 days before the show. Animals that have been vaccinated against BVD within the 12 previous months, must receive at least a single injection of modified live virus or killed vaccine given not less than 15 days and not more than 180 days before the show. The date of the live virus vaccination, or the date of the last two killed virus vaccinations must be recorded on the health chart.
- 2.) No brucellosis test is required.
- 3.) No Tuberculosis test is required
- 4.) No animals showing evidence of contagions, infections, or external parasitic disease shall be allowed entrance into the show.

13. Dress Code -

Acceptable dress will be either true black or white pants. No bib overalls or blue denim will be permitted in the Show Ring at the Regional Championship Shows or at the Spring or Fall Shows.

14. All exhibitors will be responsible for their tie and exhibit area. If an area is found littered with bottles, cans, trash, etc. on inspection by the Show Committee, that exhibitor will be banned for one year from showing cattle at Pennsylvania Holstein Association sponsored shows.

15. Bedding -

The 2008 Spring Show will require the use of Farm Show approved bedding materials. These include peanut hulls, crushed corncob and/or straw. Anyone in violation of the bedding rule will be banned for one year from showing cattle at all Pennsylvania Holstein sponsored shows.

16. Code of Ethics - The show ring "Code of Ethics" as adopted by Holstein USA Inc. and amended by Pennsylvania Holstein Association will apply.

17. Management -

The management reserves the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and will arbitrarily settle and determine all matters, questions, or differences in regard hereto or otherwise arising out of or in connection with the show.
